As Director General of the Office for National Statistics (ONS), I have been asked to reply to your recent Parliamentary Question asking Her Majesty's Government how many full-time equivalent Civil Service jobs there were (a) in total and (b) in each government department and its agencies in (i) the City of York, (ii) Yorkshire and the Humber, (iii) England and (iv) the UK (A) in May 2010 and (B) at the latest date for which figures are available. 
ONS compiles detailed information relating to the structure and distribution of Civil Service employment from the Annual Civil Service Employment Survey. The survey provides information by employee rather than by job but the survey remains the best source available to answer the question.
